Spini advised us all that she had reverted to her stash of pink chalk – and that we should only follow the pink arrows – which was sage advice if we wanted to find our way home.

Run Report – 1678- Hare Spinifex

The clouds were threatening to rain on **Spinifex**'s pink parade at Waverton.... and they fulfilled their promise with a few drops during the first part of the run..... but I have jumped the starter's gun (Melbourne Cup fever does that to you).....

The hare provided two scraps of maps with some pink lines on it (one guess on what is Spini's favourite colour)...and a verbal explanation of what they meant....where the tunnel was (it would definitely be open promised the hare), where the steps were (to be the curse of the full pack by the end of the run).... an explanation so long that **Scotch Mist** was getting worried about whether the pack (and the TM) would be able to follow it (the trail, that is)....

CIRCLE UP!!

Hannibal changed tack this week and improved our general knowledge with some interesting insights about Spinifex. I know we have all long suspected that Spinifex was flexible, strong, sensitive and could be put to many uses, but even knowing all this, Hannibal surprised us even more with these revelations – read on.

A grass native to Australia has been used to create condoms as thin as a human hair, but with no loss of strength. Spinifex grass has long been used by Aboriginal people to create adhesives for tool making, but researchers have now found a way to extract nanocellulose from it, which can be used as an additive in latex production.

A researcher said,

"We tested our spinifex latex formulation on a commercial dipping line in the United States and conducted a burst test that gets a B2H hashman to test the volume and pressure, and on average got a <u>performance increase of 20% in pressure</u> and 40% in volume compared to the commercial latex control sample." Only extra large condoms were used.

He said with more refinement, they should be able to create a latex condom that is 30% thinner but still able to pass all the B2H3 standards. "With more process optimisation work we will be able to make devices even thinner than this," he said. "Late last year we were able to get down to about 45 microns on our very first commercial dipping run, which is around the width of the hair on your head."

The Australian team believes their findings will be <u>of interest to condom manufacturers</u> that are looking to make the "thinnest, most satisfying prophylactic possible".

Spinifex has traditionally been used by populations as a resin to attach spear heads to wooden shafts AS OPPOSED TO attaching rubber to skin shafts. The university and the Dugalunji Aboriginal Corporation has since signed an agreement acknowledging their local knowledge about spinifex.

Spinifex said she was very pleased to take part in the extensive dipping testing and noted B2H3 hashmen are fantastic condom testers and if it withstands the rigorous B2H3 testing it must be a good product.
