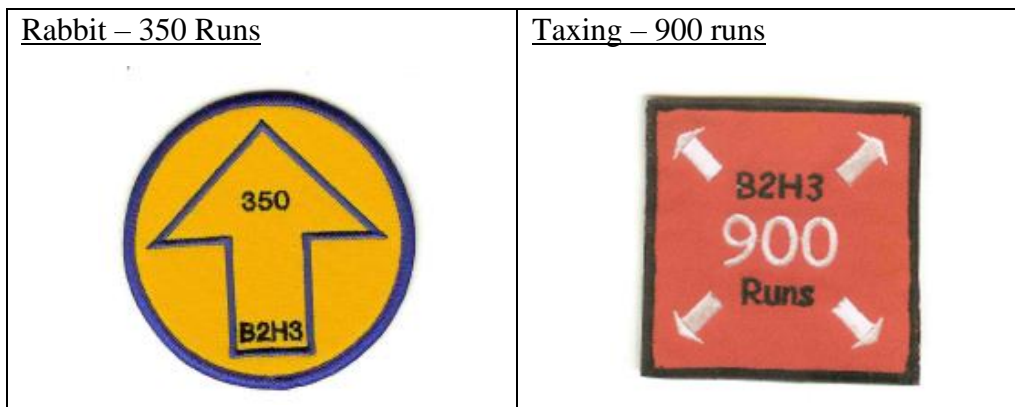
Visitors
