# **RA's Report**

Sutherland named after Forby Sutherland

Who is Forby Sutherland?

Was on the good ship Endeavour with Jimmy Cook when it sailed into Botany Bay in April 1770

He was a Scotsman and was a Poulterer – he prepared game birds for the table of the Officers on the Ship

He died on 30<sup>th</sup> April 1770 of Consumption – Tuberculosis (or did he get a chicken feather caught in his throat)

He was buried at what is now Kurnell a few days later, becoming the first known British subject to be buried on Australian soil

Captain Cook wrote in his Diary: "Last night, Forby Sutherland, Seaman, departed this life and in the am his body was buried ashore, at the watering place, which occasioned my calling the south point of this bay, after his name – Sutherlands Point

There is a memorial at Kurnell in honour of him, and a park across the railway line near the Council Chambers, named after him.
