
I was truly honoured that Dundee was the Hare for the run on my Birthday, and would he set a run that Bingo would adore, would love. No he did not.

RA's Report -

Oatley

- Named after James Oatley, a local Watchmaker
- He was a Convict, transported from the UK to Botany Bay for Life in 1814. He stole a mattress.
- He was pardoned in 1821 and made the Overseer of the Town Clock in Hyde Park Barracks
- Before 1903 the area was part of Hurstville. When the Post Office opened in 1903, it became Oatley
- Oatley is notable as the Terminus for the first Railway Electrification in Sydney in 1926. This is where the trains slept at night.
- The area was well known for farming Oysters, up until the 1990's when the farms were wiped out by the QX Disease
- The Pub opened in 1928, and it was pretty rough as the main customers were Oyster Farmers and the occasional Hasher
- It gained fame due one of its regular customers John O'Grady
- He wrote the book "They're a Weird Mob" in the 60's, and the Pub featured in the movie
- Average House price \$1.9 Million
