The town of Broome was gazetted in 1883, named after Frederick Napier Broome, the Governor of Western Australia, who was beyond horrified at his name being given to the scruffy assortment of pearling camps lining the bay. By 1914 Broome was supplying 80% of the world's pearl shell and there was over 400 luggers and 3,500 people involved in the industry. At its peak, pearl shell was worth £400 per tonne.

Most harriettes who go to Broome get at least 1 pearl necklace and many people go diving while there. Broome is home to the <u>Sun Picture Garden</u>, the oldest operating open-air cinema in the world. Broome was attacked at least four times by Japanese aircraft during World War II
